Travel with T1D

Traveling safely with T1D requires preparation. Here is a checklist for your travels.

- Insulin pump/infusion sets/cartridges
- Insulin (bring an extra bottle)
- Alcohol wipes
- Backup basal insulin
- Blood glucose testing supplies (meter, test strips, lancing device, and lancets)
- CGM transmitter, and sensors (if using)
- Receivers for pump and CGM (backups)
- Uni-Solve Adhesive Remover (if using CGM/pump)
- Micro USB charger
- Fast-acting glucose snacks (to prevent hypoglycemia.
Examples include glucose tabs/gels, Skittles, fruit juices)
- Water bottle (bring empty and refill after security)
- Glucagon/low blood sugar emergency kit
- Insulin Cooler (if going to a warm area)
- Medical alert bracelet (or alternative)
- Ketone testing strips or meter

Note: If traveling overseas and use an insulin pump and/or Dexcom, print the travel letters from each for security screenings.

Note: If flying carry on all your supplies. Do NOT check any with the airline.

Community Tips

A collection of tips and advice from our local T1D community members:

Q: What do you wish your doctor told you the day you were diagnosed?

About the Emotional Journey

- **Adjustment takes time:** It can take years to fully feel comfortable with the new normal - be patient with yourself and your family.
- **Grief is normal:** You'll experience standard stages of grief (sadness, denial, anger, bargaining) for the loss of your simpler pre-diabetes life. These feelings are real, normal, and eventually lead to acceptance.
- **Everything will be okay:** Take a deep breath and approach it step by step. While your lives will change and some days will feel like a rollercoaster, you'll find strength and be surprised by your resilience.

About the Medical Reality

- **Complications can happen if you're not careful:** Understanding this early helps with taking management seriously.
- **Every day is different:** You can do the same things daily but still have different blood sugar outcomes - this variability is normal.
- **Get technology early:** Insulin pumps and continuous glucose monitors are game-changers for management.

Q: Please provide a tip on managing Type 1 Diabetes for newly diagnosed families

Mindset and Approach

- **You manage T1D, don't let it manage you:** It will get easier and better over time.
- **Have grace with yourself:** T1D management isn't black and white - correction ranges and carb ratios change frequently, so track information and learn as you go.
- **Ask for help:** Tell people what you need, consider therapy for stress management, and find support groups.

Practical Management

- **Plan ahead for activities:** Especially with young children - bring extra snacks just in case.
- **Get freebies immediately:** Some companies only offer starter kits within the first few months or year, and age restrictions may apply.
- **Track everything:** Document as much information as possible to help identify patterns and work with your endocrinologist.
- **Teach self-advocacy:** Help your child learn the basics and feel confident advocating for themselves when needed.
- **Example low blood sugar treatments:** Juicy Juice (15 carbs), 8oz glass of whole milk (12 carbs), 3 Starbursts (12 carbs), 2 rolls of Smarties (12 carbs), GoGo SqueeZ Appleapple (15 carbs).

Q: What app, website or blog has been helpful with managing Type 1 Diabetes?

Essential Apps

- **Sugarmate:** Can call you during low blood sugar events (helpful for nighttime), tracks BG levels/insulin/food/activities, generates reports for endocrinologists, connects with iPhone calendar to show BG on CarPlay and Apple Watch
- **CalorieKing:** Look up carb counts for favorite foods and restaurant meals
- **Figwee:** Nutrition info app with photos showing food proportions
- **SugarPixel:** Game-changer for parents - shows blood sugar numbers at all times, includes vibration pendant to wake up for nighttime lows

- **Facebook Groups:** T1D Mod Squad, T1D Moms, Juicebox Podcast FB Group--there are local groups as well which can be helpful but sometimes you may want to take time to digest the diagnosis first before diving into the online communities. Also remember these communities are no substitute for medical direction from your doctor and their team!
